## South Africa Fact Sheet

## RAPE

- South Africa has the highest number of rapes per capita in the world.
- According to a 2009 study, one in four men in South Africa have admitted to rape; one in twenty say they have raped someone in the past year.
- One in ten men say they have been forced to have sex with another man.
- In May of 2006 Jacob Zuma, the current President of South Africa, and then Deputy President was acquitted of rape charges after a high profile public trial.
- It is estimated that every 26 seconds a woman is raped in South Africa.

## HIV/AIDS

- It is estimated that there are 5.7 million people living with HIV in South Africa. There are an addition 1,500 new infections every day.
- AIDS infections are down 17% over the past eight years.
- Any woman raped by a man 25 or older has a 1 in four chance of her attacker being HIV positive.
- Women who have experienced violence are at a higher risk of HIV infection: a survey among 1,366 South African women showed that women who were beaten by their partners were 48 percent more likely to be infected with HIV than those who were not.

## LAWS

- In Africa, only South Africa has enacted all relevant laws to the UN Convention to Eliminate all Forms of Violence against women.
- Only 7% of reported rapes are estimated to lead to a conviction.
- South Africa has passed laws protecting women from violence including the Domestic Violence act of 1998 and the Children's Act of 2005.
- South Africa is the only country in Africa that has legalized same-sex marriages.
